MS on paper; 164 ff.; c. 225×180 ; varying layout; book hand and semicursive script, probably several different hands; dark brown ink with red; most ff. have been repaired using silk paper; in European binding, marbled panels; the MS has been bound backwards, so that it now opens like a European book.

The original binding accompanies the rebound volume. Red-brown leather with flap, blind tooling and green medallion. On the inside of the flap is written a verse from *al-Naṣiḥa* (v. 7a-b). On the inside of the front cover the Berber name of the author is written (sidi Mhammd u Σ li Awzal).

Colophon on f. 39v, dated last day of Rabī' II 1291/1874, signed by 'Alī ibn Muhammad ibn Hmad al-Mazwārī al-Tidīlī *min* Jidārat al-'Usrā.

This MS was acquired in June 1952 as a gift from Arsène Roux, through the agency of B.H. Stricker. Several leaflets with notes in Roux's handwriting are inserted in the MS.

The notebook contains the Arabic translation of Muhammad Awzal's *Bahr aldumū* by Sī Ibrāhīm al-Kunkī (Rabat), made at the request of B.H. Stricker, through the intermediary of Arsène Roux. Stricker has added a numeration of the lines (1-1312, different from the verse numeration of the edition 1-656).

Stricker initially based his French translation of the *Bahr al-dumū* on Sī Ibrāhīm's Arabic translation. Arsène Roux then revised and corrected Stricker's translation by comparing it with the original Berber text (cf. Stricker 1960:xi).

Sī Ibrāhīm ibn Muḥammad al-Kunkī (Berber name Brahim u Muḥmmad Aknku, born 8 Dhū l-Qa'da 1323/1906) worked as répétiteur at the Institut des Hautes Études marocaines at Rabat. He was the chief native assistant of Arsène Roux in this eapacity of directeur d'études de dialectologie berbère at the same institute. His autobiography in Berber is found in MS Aix 35(a).

The Arabic text begins as follows:

قال العبد الضعيف الفقير المذنب محمد بن على السوسي عفا الله عنه: بدأت ببسم الله الرحمن ثم تتلوه الصلاة والسلام عليك يا نبي الله أحمد وعلى أزواجه وذريته وأصحابه والتابعين لهم في المنهج القويم إلى يوم الدين. وبعد: فكثيراً ما يذكر الأحبة كتاباً في الموعظة التي تفتح الآذان وتحي القلوب بالنظم البربري الفآئق العجيب وقالوا إن ما نظمته أولاً يشتمل على الفقه وأحكام الشرع فقط فجزاك الله أحسن الجزآء. إخواني الموعظة التي ذكرتموها لم أكن أهلاً لها ولكن

أرجوا الله بجاه الشيخ أن يمن علينا وعليكم ببلوغ الأمل والمني...

وكمل هذا النظم فى ربيع الثانى من عام ستة وعشرين ومائة وألف هجرية وقد بدأ فيه فى شهر صفر قبله. وأبياته ست مائة بيت وستة وخمسون بيتاً كاملاً. فمن شك ذلك فليحسبه فى الكتاب ها هو أمامه. فالصلاة والسلام عليك يا نبي الله أحمد عدد ما علمه الله كان موجوداً أو معدوماً.

Another notebook containing lexicographical annotations to the text of the *Baḥr al-dumū* 'by Sī Ibrāhīm and another of Roux's assistants, Sī Muḥammad al-Akhṣāṣī, is kept in the Fonds Roux at Aix-en-Provence (cf. van den Boogert 1997:307).

The author of the texts in this Ms is al-Madanī ibn Muḥammad ibn Muḥammad Amghar al-Ḥāḥī al-Tughmāwī al-Asemmūrī al-Jadīdī. He is explicitly mentioned as the author of texts 2, 3, 4 and 7 and he can be identified with certainty as the author of text 1. It is likely that he also composed texts 5 and 6.

- (4) **B** ff. 25r-40v: *Sirāj al-anwār li-ahl al-sirr wa-l-anwār*, an exposition in verse of the rules (*shurūt*) of the Tijāniyya order by al-Madanī al-Tughmāwī (♥).
- (5) **B** ff. 41r-52v: Verse text in praise of Aḥmad aṭTijānī and the Tijāniyya order, probably by al-Madanī al-Tughmāwī (\diamondsuit).
- (6) B ff. 53r-55v: Verse text in praise of the Prophet and Ahmad al-Tijānī, probably by al-Madanī al-Tughmāwī (\mathfrak{P}). The present copy is probably incomplete.

Ownership note on f. 1r, undated, signed by Sa'īd ibn al-Ḥasan (rest of name illegible).

The MS contains some marginal notes (ff. 2r-v, ff. 217r-221v, 225r, 234v, 234v-236r) in the handwriting of Arsène Roux. Apparently, the MS was seen, but not bought by Roux when he worked in Morocco (1920-1956). F. 1r bears the note *muqayyad* 'registered', also by Roux, indicating that he had entered the notes he made in the margins of the MS in one of his lexicographical card files.

Cod. Or. 22.322 has an identical binding with identical decorations, and seems to have been part, together with Cod. Or. 22.320, of a set, although they were written by different copyists at different dates. Both MSS were examined by Arsène Roux.

Colophon on f. 149r, dated 17 Shawwāl 1134/1721, unsigned. Colophon on f. 190v (text see below), dated 1133/1720-1, signed by 'Alī ibn Muḥammad ibn Ahmad al-Zakrī *min* Tamajut.

The copyist belonged to the Idawzkri, a tribe whose territory is adjacent to that of Awzal's tribe, the Induzal. It is therefore very well possible that he knew Awzal personally. Cod. Or. 23.463 (dated 1150/1737), was written by the same copyist.

This is the oldest manuscript containing all of Awzal's works in Berber. The part of the MS that contains the *Bahr al-dumū* was copied earlier than the rest. This part originally existed as a separate volume: f. 154r is worn and soiled, and contains various notes and texts in different hands. One note mentions the name of one of the descendants of Ibn Nāṣir. Another note is dated Ramadān 1133.

Another copy of Awzal's work, written by one of Awzal's fellow-tribesmen and with the same structure (*Bahr al-dumū* ' originally separate) is Cod. Or. 23.126.

The quires are bound in the wrong order. A part of *al-Nasīha* is found twice in the MS, probably because fragments from different MSS were used to make up this MS.

Colophon on p. 270, dated Ramadān 1234/1819, signed by 'the offspring of Abū Hafs' (*najl Abū Hafs*), i.e. probably a descendant of Abū Hafs 'Umar ibn Ahmad al-Anṣārī who founded the famous *zāwiya* at Tamggrut in 983/1575-6.

Colophon on f. 18r, dated 22 Muḥarram 1332/1913, signed by al-Ḥasan ibn Muḥammad Afrkki al-S.mīdī. The Berber nickname *afrkki* means 'crust, bark'. The copyist may be a descendant of Aḥmad ibn Muḥammad al-Īsāffnī, nicknamed Asmmid 'cold wind' (cf. *Rijālāt* 211).

Colophon on f. 164v, dated 1328/1910, signed by Muhammad ibn Muhammad ibn 'Abd Allāh (no *nisba*).

The ff. 1-6 and 165-168 were added to the main body of the MS at a later date and contain texts in a different hand (cursive script). An unsigned colophon on f.4r is dated Jumādā II 1339/1921. The name Muḥammad ibn *al-ḥājj* Sa'īd Axrḍiḍ is mentioned at the foot of the page, but in a different hand; it is unclear whether this is the name of the copyist.

An inscription in ballpoint on the inside of the front board mentions the name of Muhammad Axrdid (cf. Cod. Or. 22.775):

MS on paper; 235 ff., 213×170 (160 \times 105); varying layout, mostly 22 lines; book hand; black ink with red and blue; the block is inserted in a non-matching

binding, dark brown leather with asymmetric blind-tooled decorations.

The design and decorations of the binding has a decidedly "Saharan" look. The boards are made of thick, stiff squares of leather instead of the usual glued-together old manuscript leaves.

Colophons dated Dhū l-Ḥijja 1283/1867 (f. 169v, in simple decorated border), 16 Rabīʻ I 1284/1867 (f. 199r), 1284/1867-8 (f. 223r) and Shawwāl 1281/1865 (f. 235v), signed by Aḥmad ibn Muḥammad ibn Muḥammad Ahmmu al-Busksuyī al-Brayyimī *min* (or *al-sākin fī*) Ḥiṣn al-Aḥmar. There are numerous marginal notes throughout the MS, mainly in the hand of the copyist.

Although this MS contains only texts in Arabic, it is included in the present catalogue because one of the texts (text 5) is by Muhammad Awzal. There are also a few Berber glosses (noted below).

ibn Muḥammad ibn 'Abd Allāh ibn Ya'qūb al-Samlālī al-Adūzī (d. 1221/1806, *Rijālāt* 84, *Sūs* 196). The title of the commentary is mentioned in the margin on f. 35v. The name of the author is mentioned in the margin on f. 35v and in the text on f. 169r. The commentary was completed in Rajab 1203/1789 (date mentioned in the text on f. 169r). The author belonged to a family of scholars who originated from the Idawsmlal tribe and who were based in the town of Aduz in the territory of the Idawbɛqil, the location of a famous college (hence al-Sūsī mentions them among the Ba'qīliyyūn, cf. *Rijālāt* 124). He was the 'qādī and the *imām* of the Anti-Atlas' (qādī Juzūla wa-imāmuhā, Rijālāt 84). On f. 128v there is a schematic drawing of the Ka'ba (sūrat al-ka'ba) in black, red and blue. On f. 166r a Berber gloss is written between the lines (taḥzzart).

Photocopies; 103 pp.; 310×210 ; 13 lines; some parts of the text that were badly legible were retouched with a green or blue felt pen. The original MS is written on ruled paper of approximately the same size as the photocopy.

Colophon on p. 103, undated, signed by al-Ḥusayn ibn *al-ḥājj* Aḥmad ibn *al-ḥājj* Muḥammad ibn Ḥmad ibn al-Ḥusayn u 'Alī al-Takūshtī al-Ṣawābī (cf. *Rijālāt* 117).

Two notes, added in a different hand in the margins of p. 103, mention two other names: wa-nuqila minhu al-Bushwārī 'Abd Allāh al-Tiyyiwtī; (inside square:) al-ḥājj Aḥmad ibn al-faqīh al-sayyid al-ḥājj Muḥammad ibn Aḥmad al-Takushtī, maktab Tanālt, Ayt Ṣwāb. Tanalt is a town in the territory of the Ayt Ṣwab.

(-) **B(A)** pp. 1-103: Collection of medicinal recipes and charms by Muḥammad ibn 'Alī al-Ba'qīlī (author's name not mentioned in this MS) (\$\tilde{\pi}\$). Heading:

The first five recipes found in most other MSS are omitted here, the first recipe in the MS being asafar n jjrh 'remedy for a wound'.

Colophon on p. 105, dated 9 Ramadan 1388/1968, unsigned.

The MS seems to contains at least three texts, dealing with various subjects. In the layout, no clear division is made between the various parts. Presumably, the whole text of the MS was composed by the same author. Cod. Or. 23.313 is another photocopy of the same MS:

Colophon on f. 130v, dated Shawwāl 1131/1719, signed by 'Alī ibn 'Abd Allāh al-Fanwānī al-Sanhājī.

This is the only Awzal Ms of which the exemplar is known with certainty. As the copyist states in the colophon on f. 130v, the manuscript was copied from an autograph manuscript:

The autograph mentioned by the copyist can with certainty be identified as Rabat Q125, because f. 48v of the Leiden MS contains a literal copy of the colophon found on p. 73 of the Rabat MS:

انتهى كتاب القواعد الخمس المزغى المسمى بالحوض على يد ناظمه بخط يده ايده الله تعلى بتوفيقه وختم عليه وعلى جميع المسلمين بالخير في دى الحجة عام 1122.

In the Rabat MS, two folios containing *al-Ḥawd* part 1, vv. 1-57 are missing. The Leiden MS contains the complete text of *al-Ḥawd* part 1, but the text on f. 1v appears to written in a hand which is different from that in the rest of the MS.

Muḥammad al-Tīzekhtī is explicitly mentioned as the author of this text; it is probable that he is also the author of texts 4-16.

- (7) **B** ff. 53r-54v: Anonymous verse text (100 dist.) on the 'matters of the wrongdoings' (*laxbar n lhafawat*) ($\stackrel{\triangle}{\Box}$).
- (8) B ff. 55r-55v: Anonymous verse text (41 dist.) on the 'ten sinners' (♥).
- (9) B ff. 55v-56r: Anonymous verse text (30½ dist.), admonition with references to life in the Hereafter.
- (10) B ff. 56v-59v: Anonymous verse text (58 dist.) on the misbehaviour of

women (♥).

- (11) B ff. 58v: Anonymous verse text (12½ dist.) in praise of the Prophet, incomplete at the end.
- (12) B ff. 59r-v: Anonymous verse text (46 dist.) on the pleasures of Paradise (\$\infty\$), incomplete at the beginning. The last two lines are identical with vv. 5b-6a of the previous text, hence it is possible that this text is in fact the end of the previous text.

The commentary was completed in Sha'bān 1028/1619 (cf. f. 194r). It is mentioned in *Sūs* 184-5. According to *Sūs* 177, the *Samlāliyya* is well-known among the Berber of the Sous, 'who learn arithmetic with it to this very day.'
- (32) A f. 194r: *Mas'ala* concerning the admissibility of performing the prayer 'behind a murderer' (al-salāt khalf al-qātil).
- (33) A f. 194v: Various notes (added in a different hand). The first note is as follows:

- (4) A pp. 11-44: Anonymous glossary of plant names, referred to at the end as a *Kashf al-rumūz*, alphabetically arranged in the Maghribī order (with *lām-alif* as a separate letter). With a short appendix on the alchemistic names of some chemical substances. Incipit:

(8) A pp. 63-64: Diploma (*ijāza*), dated Ramadān 1111/1700, granted to Abū 'Abd Allāh Muḥammad ibn 'Alī ibn Ibrāhīm al-Induzālī al-Sūsī (i.e. Muḥammad Awzal) by Aḥmad ibn Muḥammad al-Hashtūkī. Two persons who may be identified with this al-Hashtūkī are mentioned by al-Sūsī (Aḥmad ibn Muḥammad al-Yiburkī al-Asgherkīsī al-Hashtūkī, d. 1149/1736-7, *Rijālāt* 63; Aḥmad ibn Muḥammad Aḥuziy al-Hashtūkī, d. 1127/1715, *Rijālāt* 73). - (19) A pp. 144-146: Muḥammad Awzal, *Mahāmiz al-ghaflān*. Text without the commentary (see text 7, above).
- (20) A pp. 147-149: Muhammad Awzal, *Tanbīh al-ikhwān*. Text without the commentary (see text 9, above).
- (21) A p. 150: A poem (23 vv.) by al-shaykh al-sayyid Ahmad ibn 'Abd al-Qādir (12 c., cf. GAL S II 999?).
- (22) A pp. 151-152: A poem (28 vv.) concerning marriage, with reference to a commentary on Khalīl's *Mukhtasar* by *al-shaykh al-imām* Bahrām (d. 815/1412, *GAL* G II 85, S II 99).
- (23) A p. 153: Anonymous text in which correspondences are given between the days of the week and spirits (arwāh), angels (al-mulūk, sic), kinds of incense (al-bakhūr), planets (al-darārī), metals (ma'ādin) and the signs of the zodiac (al-

- (24) A p. 154: Quotation from *al-Ḥiṣn al-ḥaṣīn fī kalām sayyid al-mursalīn*, a book of prayers composed by Muḥammad ibn Muḥammad ibn al-Jazarī (d. 833/1429, *GAL* G II 203; name of the author not mentioned in the MS).
- (25) A p. 154: Quotation ascribed to Ibrāhīm ibn Adham (unidentified).
- (26) A p. 154 (margin): Quotation from *al-sifr al-thālith* (?) by *al-imām* al-Suyūṭī (d. 911/1505, *GAL* G II 151).
- (27) A p. 155: Quotation from *Kitāb al-istiqṣā' wa-l-ibrām fī 'ilāj al-jurūḥāt wa-l-awrām*, a medical treatise ascribed in the MS to Ibn Faraḥ al-Mutaṭabbib al-Fihrī. The *GAL* mentions Muḥammad ibn 'Alī ibn Faraḥ al-Shafra al-Qirbilyānī (d. 722/1322, *GAL* S II 366, cf. Ullmann, *Die Medizin* 177) as the author of a work with this title.
- (28) A p. 155: A hadīth attributed to Abū 1-'Abbās al-Hadramī.
- (29) A p. 156-158: Various mas'alas. On p. 158 a mas'ala about whether zakāt is payable on the oil extracted from the fruits of the harjān tree. This tree, called argan in Berber (Argania spinosa, Sapotaceae), is endemic in the South of Morocco (cf. Encyclopédie berbère s.v. 'Argan'). It is widely cultivated in this area, especially in the coastal area between Essaouira and Agadir. The question of zakāt is relevant because argan fruits are much less juicy than olives and the extraction of the oil is a very laborious task. The answer given in the mas'ala is that the zakāt is payable, provided that the tree is cultivated and produces more than five awsuq of fruits:

وسئل الشيخ ابو محمد عن الهرجان هل فيه الزكات بمنزلة الزيتون. قال نعم اذا كان في ملكه وارضه فجمع من نواته خمسة اوسق فحاله حال الزيتون وان جمعه من السحاري او موضع لا يملكه فلا زكات عليه.

The same matter is brought up by Muhammad Awzal in *al-Hawd* part 1, vv. 764-765: 'there is difference of opinion whether *zakāt* is payable on *argan* oil' (*illa lxilaf gh wargan saw gisn zzka*). In Awzal's opinion the *zakāt* is not payable, 'because the effort required to produce *argan* oil exceeds it value' (*ašku yuti ššąa n wargan atig nns*).

- (34) A p. 165 (p. 164 blank): Story about Shaqīq al-Balkhī (wa-ḥukiya 'an Shaqīq al-Balkhī annahū qāl...).
- (35) A p. 165: A note on the angel Jibrīl (wa-qad warida fī al-qisas wa-l-āthār...).
- (36) A p. 167 (p. 166 blank): Story about Ibrāhīm al-Khawwāṣ (hikāya 'an Ibrāhīm al-Khawwās annahū qāl...)

(43) A p. 187-189: An *urjūza* (62 vv.) on ritual slaughter (*dhakāt*) by Abū Zayd 'Abd al-Raḥmān al-Raqa'ī. The *GAL* (S I 662) mentions 'Abd al-Raḥmān al-Raqa'ī, author of a versification of Ibn Rushd's *Muqaddima fī l-farā'id* (cf. Cod. Or. 23.333 text 15). See also *GAL* S II 340 (Abū Zayd al-Fāsī, extracts from Ibn al-Aḥmar's *Mashāhīr buyūtāt Fās*), S II 354 (Abū Zayd 'Abd al-Raḥmān al-Fāsī al-'Ārif, cmt. on *al-Sanūsiyya*), S I 805 (Abū Zayd 'Abd al-Raḥmān al-Fāsī, cmt. on al-Shādhilī's *al-Hizb al-kabīr*. Cf. also text 45, below. Incipit:

علم الدكات حده باليقين فرض وداك من فرض الدين لانه لاكلنا يستوعبه والاكل لا يحل الا الطيبة

(44) A p. 190: A khutba.

- (45) A p. 191-218: An *urjūza* containing medicinal recipes by Abū Zayd 'Abd al-Rahmān ibn Muḥammad ibn Mas'ūd ibn 'Umar ibn Mūsā al-Fārisī (= al-Fāsī? cf. text 43, above). The text ends abruptly on p. 218 and the end seems to be missing (the Ms contains 465 verses). In the margins other recipes are added, some of them added in a different hand.
- (46) A p. 219-227: Extracts from an *urjūza* on medicine entitled *Takmilat alaghrād fī muzāwālat al-amrād* by Abū Zakariyyā' ibn Hudhayl (unidentified). The text in the MS contains (parts of) chapters 16-18.
- (47) A p. 223-224 (text 46 continues from p. 222 on 224): A magic square (?). Around the edge are written the words taraka / al-khāmis / al-mājūz / wa-l-kabs.
- (48) A p. 224: A circle divided into concentric rings. The innermost ring contains a division of the circle into four quadrants, one each for the four elements. The second ring contains the names of the signs of the zodiac, placed consecutively in the four quadrants: al-haml in the first, al-thawr in the second, al- $jawz\bar{a}$ ' in the third, etc. The third ring contains eleven combinations of three letters and one group of five letters. This seems to be another classification of the letters according to the four elements which is different from the classification on p. 44 (cf. text 5 above). The fourth ring contains the letters of the abjad. The letters are placed consecutively in the four quadrants: alif in the first, $b\bar{a}$ ' in the second, $d\bar{a}l$ in the third, etc. The outer ring contains the names of the lunar mansions ($man\bar{a}zil\ al$ -qamar), also arranged consecutively in the four

quadrants.

- (57) A p. 247: Another quotation from *Tuhfat al-'arūs* (see text 55, above).

- (59) A p. 248: Quotation from the *Kitāb adab al-aṭibbā'*, i.e. perhaps from the *Kitāb adab al-ṭabīb* by Isḥāq in 'Alī al-Ruhāwī (2nd half 9th c., Ullmann, *Die Medizin* 223).

- (61) A p. 249-250: Several short anonymous poems and a summary of a story (hukiya 'an ba'd al-'Alawiyyīn...).

Interestingly, in GAL G II 463 and S II 707, al-Marghītī and a descendant of a Yūsuf al-Fāsī are mentioned next to each other.
- (64) A p. 429: Quote from the commentary on the *Risāla* by Ibn Nājī (perhaps al-Qāsim ibn 'Īsā Ibn al-Nājī, d. 837/1433, *GAL* S II 337).

- (66) A p. 430: A multiplication table (himārat al-hisāb) in abjad. The letter combinations are vocalized as pronounceable words which can be memorized and recited. The two-times table (bāb ithnayn fī thnayn) is as follows:

clear from the layout that this is a verse text in the rajaz metre. The contents are arranged alphabetically (Maghribī order). Incipit:

The text is accompanied by numerous marginal notes, in the same hand, concerning materia medica and containing additional recipes, with many Berber of names of plants, diseases, etc. The notes also contain frequent references to al-Shabbī, author of a well-known treatise on medicine entitled Jumla min alfawā'id al-tibbiyya (extant in Aix MSS 32(b), 66, 99).

The text on f. 10v is to be read before that on f. 10r according to a note at the bottom of f. 10v. There are lacunae in the MS between ff. 10-11, ff. 12-13 and ff. 14-15. Colophon (f. 23r):

The copyist estimates that his father was between sixty and seventy years old, as 'his hair and his beard were half white, half black'.
- (16) A(B) f. 38v: Note by the copyist concerning an iron gun barrel of the type tasdda Ugadir 'lioness of Agadir', which he sent for repairs to someone of the Idawsmlal tribe. Also a note concerning a heritage (?) and a note recording the death of the copyist's paternal aunt 'Ā'isha, and the marriage of his sister Khadīja.

Oval ownership stamps on ff. 14r and 47r: *al-maktaba al-'ilmiyya*, *li-ṣāḥibihā al-'Arabī al-Hilālī*, *Miknās*.

- (1) A (margins): There are marginal notes throughout the MS. Most of these are unrelated to the main texts. Subjects include medicinal recipes and charms, notes on history, lexicography and chronology, and pieces of poetry. One interesting group of notes is described separately (text 24 below).
- (2) A ff. 2r-5v (some notes on f. 1r; f. 1v blank): Masarrat al-ikhwān bi-tayb dhikr shaykhinā al-rabbānī, an urjūza on the silsila of the Nāṣiriyya, the Zarrūqiyya and other mystic orders, by Abu Bakr ibn Muḥammad ibn Ibrāhīm al-Sūsī al-M.s.gālī min Jabal Darna (i.e from the High Atlas, perhaps from the tribe named 'Meskala', part of the Chiadma confederation). The title is mentioned in the text on f. 5r as Musarrat al-akhwān (sic). A chronogram dates the completion of the text to the month Rajab of the year tayqash (1109/...).
- (3) A f. 5v: A medicinal recipe and a short hikāya ma'nawiyya.
- (4) A ff. 5v-12r: A collection of *masā'il* based on *al-Dalā'il wa-l-īdāh* by Abū 'Imrān al-Fāsī (cf. *GAL* S II 961), *Riyā' Mawrid al-dham'ān fī tafsīr al-qur'ān* (cf. *GAL* G II 248), al-Wansharīsī's *al-Mi'yār* and other works.

A note in the top-margin of f. 9v reads: *Madīnat al-Mankib: hākadhā qāla fī l-Mi'yār ya'nī bihī Agadir y Yiqir, wa-llāhu a'lam*. Agadir y Yiqir 'Fortress of the promontory (shoulder)' is the Berber name of the port city of Agadir.

Manşūr ibn Muḥammad al-Hashtūkī could not be identified.

- (20) A f. 40r: A *jawāb*, copied by 'Alī ibn Muhammad from Ahmad ibn 'Alī al-Tiggī (of the Intugga).
- (21) A ff. 40v-42v: A summary of the *kalām al-Imām al-Ya'murī* by Muḥammad ibn Sa'īd al-Marghītī (d. 1089/1678, *Rijālāt* 40; cf. *Sūs* 182, *mukhtaṣar Sīrat al-Ya'murī*).
- (22) A ff. 42v-47r: Extract from the commentary of Muhammad ibn 'Alī Ak^wbil on his own *nadhm 'alā al-badā'i'*, i.e. Muhammad Awzal's *Tanbīh al-ikhwān* 'alā tark al-bida' wa-l-'iṣyān (♥), and extracts from various other works.

The MS shows a great variety of hands, and contains a large number of texts, mainly on Koran recitation, chronology and medicine.

The larger part of the MS was copied by 'Abd al-Mālik (or Mālik) ibn *al-hājj* Muḥammad ibn Bella al-Ma'lāwī, who has signed his name of f. 24v, with dated colophons on f. 38r (last day of Jumādā II 1284/1867), f. 55r (1 Sha'bān 1284/1867), f. 102v (Jumādā II 1283/1866), f. 117v (128[-], last number omitted), f. 130r (6 Ramadān 12[.]0). This copyist presents himself as *al-qār[i']* waqtahū fī Ayt Σisa (f. 102v) and al-qāri' wāqtahū bi-masjid Ayt Ḥammū (117v). The Ayt Ḥammu Σisa are a tribe of the Izayan federation of the Middle Atlas. There are separate tribes in the same area named Ayt Σisa and Ayt Ḥammu.
